- 2. ANGEN 2.0 network buildout
 - a. Aggressive network buildout to the PSAPs underway (see attached MAP). The goal is to have the ESi-Net built to the PSAPs near the end of the year.
 - Meeting was held in Fort Wayne on November 6th concerning Phase 2 rollout - this will begin in January.
 - c. Continued focus on the turn-up of transfer trunks
 - i. All are connected to the ANGEN network
 - ii. First full set of router to router trunks with AT&T have been turned up. Next step is to coordinate transfer codes.
 - d. Blue Counties ready for turnup, Orange scheduled for ANGEN installation
- 3. MEVO is continually being voluntarily utilized in the Wiregrass during CPE maintenance.
 - a. Circuits are being installed in the Wiregrass and tested in preparation for transition of the ECW platform from ASA to INdigital's network







Hurricane Michael Data

- About 1,000 more calls in this region than a normal day






Calls by Time of Day



Calls by Day of Week since Last Report






ESRP Transaction Counts 2018-02-12 to 2018-11-04





March, May, September, and November Tickets

Application Process

Step 1: Those who intend to apply for a grant must submit an initial application package, including identification of a designated 911 Coordinator and the required certification, via <u>nhtsa.national911@dot.gov</u> by September 10, 2018.

Step 2: Once applicants have submitted the initial application, NHTSA and <u>NTIA</u> will publish preliminary funding allocations for each of the States or Tribal Organizations meeting the certification requirements on <u>www.grants.gov</u>.




